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### METHODS OF TEACHING ENGLISH PHONETICS

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

symbols, "seat" will be written /si:t/ and "eat" will be /i:t/. You can find a list of phonetic symbols on several websites or in introductory linguistics textbooks. Once you teach your students the International Phonetic Alphabet, you can use these symbols every time you introduce new vocabulary.

#### 7. Vowel diagram

If you're using phonetic symbols to help teach vowel pronunciation, a diagram that shows where each sound in English is pronounced can help your students better understand pronunciation. Print copies to distribute in class or show students where they can find this diagram online. When students know in which area of the mouth they should make sounds, it may be easier for them to distinguish similar sounds because they are produced in different areas of the mouth.

### 8. Singing

Surprisingly, singing can be a good way for students to learn vowel pronunciation. Because singing requires one to maintain vowel sounds for more than a moment, it gives your students the opportunity to focus on the target sound and regulate the sound they produce.

#### 9. Tongue twisters

While tongue twisters are probably more popular for practicing consonant pronunciation, they are also a valuable resource for practicing vowel pronunciation.
