

THE ROLE OF MULTILINGUAL COMPETENCE IN MODERN INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS

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Abstract. In the context of globalization processes, multilingual competence is increasingly recognized as an indispensable professional and strategic asset in international relations. This research is devoted to a comprehensive analysis of the contribution of language proficiency to diplomatic effectiveness, the implementation of "soft power" strategies, and the processes of intercultural dialogue and global partnership. Applying a qualitative analytical methodology, the article investigates the functional determinants of multilingualism within diplomacy, international structures, security cooperation, and economic integration. The research findings confirm the strategic significance of multilingual competence in optimizing negotiation potential, supporting mechanisms of preventive diplomacy, and strengthening international platforms of trust. The study concludes with a scientific justification that multilingual education must serve as a fundamental component of professional training programs for specialists in the fields of "International Relations" and "World Languages."

Annotatsiya. Globallasuv jarayonlari sharoitida ko'p tilli kompetensiya xalqaro munosabatlarda muhim professional va strategik omil sifatida tobora e'tirof etilmoqda. Mazkur tadqiqot til bilish darajasining diplomatik samaradorlikka qo'shgan hissasi, "yumshoq kuch" strategiyalarini amalga oshirish hamda madaniyatlararo muloqot va global hamkorlik jarayonlariga ta'sirini kompleks tahlil qilishga bag'ishlangan. Sifatli analitik metodologiya asosida maqolada diplomatiya, xalqaro tuzilmalar, xavfsizlik hamkorligi va iqtisodiy integratsiya doirasida ko'p tillilikning funksional determinantlari o'rganilgan. Tadqiqot natijalari ko'p tilli kompetensiyaning muzokara salohiyatini optimallashtirish, preventiv diplomatiya mexanizmlarini qo'llab-quvvatlash hamda xalqaro ishonch platformalarini mustahkamlashdagi strategik ahamiyatini tasdiqlaydi. Tadqiqot yakunida ko'p tilli ta'lim "Xalqaro munosabatlar" va "Jahon tillari" yo'nalishlari bo'yicha mutaxassislarni tayyorlash dasturlarining asosiy komponenti bo'lishi zarurligi ilmiy asoslab beriladi.

Аннотация. В условиях глобализационных процессов многоязычная компетенция все более признается важным профессиональным и стратегическим ресурсом в международных отношениях. Данное исследование посвящено комплексному анализу вклада языковой компетенции в дипломатическую эффективность, реализацию стратегий «мягкой силы», а также процессы межкультурного диалога и глобального партнерства. На основе качественной аналитической методологии в статье рассматриваются функциональные детерминанты многоязычия в дипломатии, международных структурах, сотрудничестве в сфере безопасности и экономической интеграции. Результаты исследования подтверждают стратегическую значимость многоязычной компетенции в оптимизации переговорного потенциала, поддержке механизмов превентивной дипломатии и укреплении международных платформ доверия. В заключение обосновывается необходимость включения многоязычного образования в качестве ключевого компонента программ профессиональной подготовки специалистов в области «Международные отношения» и «Мировые языки».

Introduction. Contemporary international relations are undergoing a transformation based on the processes of globalization and the paradigm of complex interdependence among states and institutions. Establishing effective communication across linguistic and linguacultural boundaries is increasingly viewed as a fundamental requirement for modern diplomacy, international partnership, and conflict resolution processes. In this context, language serves not merely as a technical instrument of connection but manifests as a marker of political values, subjective cultural identity, and strategic determination (Crystal, 2010).

The growing strategic significance of multilingual competence is a consequence of fundamental shifts in the global governance architecture. Diplomats, political analysts, and specialists operating within conditions of international rivalry or partnership must possess the ability to interpret political discourse, engage directly with primary sources, and conduct negotiations within diverse cultural and civilizational contexts. Academic research confirms that language proficiency optimizes intercultural understanding and minimizes the risk of semantic misinterpretation in international relations (Samovar et al., 2017).

Furthermore, multilingualism plays a decisive role in enhancing the "soft power" potential of states. This strategy enables nations to project their influence not through coercion or force, but through socio-educational resources and communicative diplomacy (Nye, 2004). Consequently, studying the strategic determinants of language within the spheres of diplomacy and international cooperation must serve as the conceptual foundation for professional training in the fields of "International Relations" and "World Languages."

The objective of this research is to conduct a comprehensive analysis of the following scholarly issues:

The functional-contextual role of multilingual competence in diplomatic activities;

The role of language within global governance structures and international organizations;

The impact of multilingualism on the effectiveness of global security and international cooperation;

Linguocognitive factors in the professional development of international relations.

Methodology. This research employs a qualitative analytical approach established at the interdisciplinary intersections of international relations, sociolinguistics, and intercultural communication. The theoretical and methodological framework of the study is constructed upon the following fundamental concepts:

Linguistic Globalization: The global transformation of language and its role in shaping social and international relations (Crystal, 2010); "Soft Power" Theory: The role of language as a strategic tool of influence in the foreign policy of states (Nye, 2004); Intercultural Communication Paradigms: The dynamics of effective interaction and mutual understanding across diverse cultural environments (Samovar et al., 2017); Global

Pedagogy: Issues of language instruction and competence development within a global context (Risager, 2007). The conceptual analysis method was extensively utilized throughout the research process. Through this method, the constructive contribution of multilingual competence to diplomatic practice, inter-institutional integration, and global partnership was systematically analyzed. Furthermore, perspectives from international relations theory (Burchill & Linklater, 2013) were applied to scientifically interpret the functional significance of language as a strategic resource within international arenas.

Results. The conducted analysis yields the following primary findings regarding the role of multilingual competence:

Our research demonstrates that multilingualism elevates the quality of diplomatic relations to a new level. A diplomat proficient in languages operates independently of interpreters, which ensures the accurate transmission of information without distortion (Crystal, 2010). Communicating in a counterpart's native language is not merely a means of connection; it serves as a powerful tool for establishing trust during the negotiation process.

Language proficiency allows for the "unfiltered" (untranslated) reception of official documents and political speeches in international arenas. This enables diplomats to perceive hidden meanings and political nuances, thereby avoiding interpretative bias. Consequently, the risk of error in strategic decision-making is significantly reduced.

Multilingualism is considered one of the most potent instruments of modern diplomacy (Nye, 2004):

Cultural Affinity: Through language learning, we gain a deeper understanding of the culture and traditions of other nations, paving the way for long-term strategic partnerships.

Global Elites: Young professionals formed through language schools and educational exchange programs become a core force in shaping favorable international perceptions (Risager, 2007).

Today, international institutions operate based on the principle of multilingualism. The presence of multilingual specialists is critical in the following areas:

Managing negotiation and peacebuilding processes; Drafting intergovernmental strategic documents; Acting as a "bridge" between representatives of diverse cultures. These skills enhance operational effectiveness in multinational environments (Burchill & Linklater, 2013).

Multilingual competence fosters respect and adaptability toward other cultures (Samovar et al., 2017). A direct understanding of regional political rhetoric (and its nuances) strengthens security cooperation. Furthermore, in international economic negotiations, mutual clarity between parties serves as a guarantee for successful trade outcomes.

Discussion. The primary findings of our study confirm that in contemporary international relations, multilingual competence has evolved beyond a mere communication tool into a strategic resource and intellectual capital.

From a diplomatic perspective, language proficiency is the most effective way to reduce the "psychological distance" between parties. Crystal's (2010) assertion that language is a fundamental component of international engagement essentially implies that "language is the key to trust." Communicating directly (without translation) at the negotiation table allows a diplomat to perceive the emotional nuances of the text and enables rapid decision-making in unforeseen circumstances.

When linked to Nye's (2004) "soft power" theory, multilingualism enhances a state's international "attractiveness." The more a country's language is studied abroad and the more professionals speak it, the higher that state's geopolitical influence becomes. Educational exchange programs serve as a prime example: a language learner does not merely acquire words but internalizes the worldview of that nation.

The perspectives of Samovar et al. (2017) demonstrate that the process of language learning fosters cultural sensitivity. In international relations, many conflicts arise not from a misunderstanding of "what was said," but from an inability to perceive "how it was said" (the context). In this regard, multilingualism acts as a "cultural lens," allowing for a clear understanding of the other party's intentions and facilitating an environment of cooperation rather than confrontation (Burchill & Linklater, 2013).

Potential Risks and Institutional Solutions Furthermore, our research identified several "nuances" of multilingual communication:

Complexity of Interpretation: The meaning of words can vary across different cultures (ambiguity), which may lead to "terminological errors." **Linguistic Dominance:** The dominance of certain global languages (e.g., English) may suppress the "voices" of other languages and cultures.

To mitigate these challenges, it is necessary to go beyond simple dictionaries and require the institutionalization of continuous linguistic support and principles of multiculturalism at the international level.

Conclusions. The results of this interdisciplinary research confirm that in the contemporary system of international relations, multilingual competence is of fundamental importance for optimizing diplomatic activity, effectively implementing "soft power" strategies, and accelerating global integration processes. Beyond fostering constructive and credible intercultural dialogue, this competence directly serves the resolution of international conflicts through preventive diplomacy and elevates global economic partnership to a qualitatively new level. For future specialists in the fields of International Relations, Law, and World Languages, multilingualism is not merely an academic skill but a high-level professional imperative (professional necessity). To protect national interests amidst complex geopolitical and geo-economic processes on the global stage and to

conduct impactful activities internationally, the integration of linguistic training with deep cultural and political studies is considered a strategic necessity. Only by mastering language alongside its socio-political context can we guarantee the preparation of specialists capable of adequately meeting the complex challenges of modern diplomacy.

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
